











OS X: Taking a Picture of the Screen

This *Quickstart* explains how to create a snapshot of your screen using the Digital Media Creation Stations.

To create a picture file of all or part of your Macintosh screen, hold down these keys. A plus sign (+) means keys are held down together.

 +  + 	Creates a picture file of the entire screen.
 +  + 	Creates a picture file of a rectangular section of the screen. (After pressing and releasing the key combination, drag across the part of the screen you want to take a picture of.)
 +  +  + 	Creates a picture file of a window. (After pressing and releasing the key combination, click the window you want to take a picture of.)

The file is automatically saved to the Desktop. You must drag and drop the file onto the SAVE FILES HERE drive, eDisk, Zip Disk, or CD-R.
